The Town of Livingston, Tennessee will receive separate sealed BIDS for the construction of a water project at City Hall, 301 McHenry Circle, Livingston, Tennessee until Thursday, May 24, 2007 at 2:00 P.M. CDT and, then, at said time, publicly open and read the BIDS aloud.

The work to be bid on is as follows:

- Cumberland River Intake Structure
- Traveling Water Screen
- 500 HP Raw Water Pump

CDT Thursday, May 17, 2007. The submitting party is responsible for delivery and completeness; fax submittals are unacceptable.

This project is funded by a loan from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, SRF Project No. DWF 2004-059.

Minority Business Enterprise/Women's Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE) Requirements

Any contract or contracts awarded by the Owner through this invitation for bids will be funded by a State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan from the State of Tennessee. State and Federal funds will be involved in this project and, as a result, Bidders must comply with the SRF Loan Program's MBE/WBE requirements including contacting a minimum of 10 qualified MBE/WBE potential sub-contractors, professional service providers, vendors, and/or suppliers by certified mail to solicit bids. The apparent successful Bidder must submit to the Owner copies of the certified letters and return receipts prior to contract award. Neither the State of Tennessee nor any of its departments, agencies, or employees is or will be a party to this Invitation for Bids or any resulting contract(s) awarded by the Owner.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO MBE/WBE FIRMS

All qualified MBE/WBE firms desiring to bid as a General Contractor, sub-contractor, professional service provider, supplier, or equipment vendor are encouraged to contact Ms. Marilyn Robinson at the Nashville Minority Business Center office listed above to review bidding/contract documents. Qualified MBE/WBE firms may also contact {Name of the Engineer, office address, and phone number}, in

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order to obtain a list of prospective bidding General Contractors or to obtain copies of bidding/contract documents.

The Contractor must attempt to utilize Office of Minority Business Enterprise (OMBE) and Women's Business Enterprise (WBE) firms on this project. The OMBE goal for this project is 12.0 percent. The WBE goal for this project is 6.9 percent. Each bidder will be required to submit documentation of its OMBE and WBE solicitations with his/her bid in order to be awarded a contract.

All interested OMBE/WBE firms desiring to bid as a General Contractor or Subcontractor are encouraged to contact the OMBE/WBE office listed above or the office of the Engineer, for a list of prospective bidders or contract documents.

Each bidder must deposit with his bid, security in the amount, form and subject to the conditions provided in the Information for Bidders.

All bidders must be licensed general contractors as required by the Contractor's Licensing Act of 1976 of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee, and qualified for the type of construction being bid upon. Each bidder shall write on the outside of the envelope containing his bid his contractor's license number, the expiration date, and that part of the classification applying to this bid. If this is not done, the bid will not be opened.

The Contractor shall abide by the provisions of TCA 62-6-119(b) which requires stating the names of the subcontractors for electrical, plumbing, heating, ventilating, and air conditioning on the outside of the bid envelope.

The successful bidder is required to furnish both an acceptable performance bond and payment bond each in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price.

The Owner reserves the right to reject any all bids, to waive informalities, and to negotiate with the apparent qualified best bidder or bidders to such extent as may be necessary.

No bidder may withdraw his bid for 60 days, while the Owner considers the bids. Mutually agreed upon time extensions may be made if necessary.
